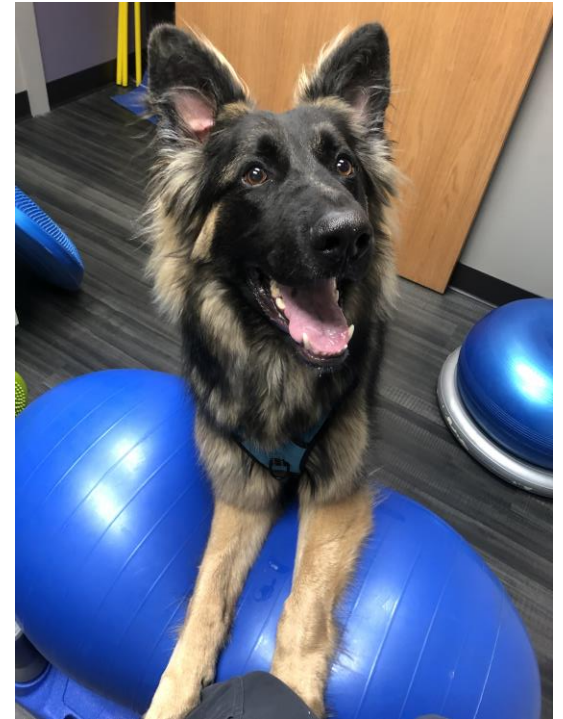
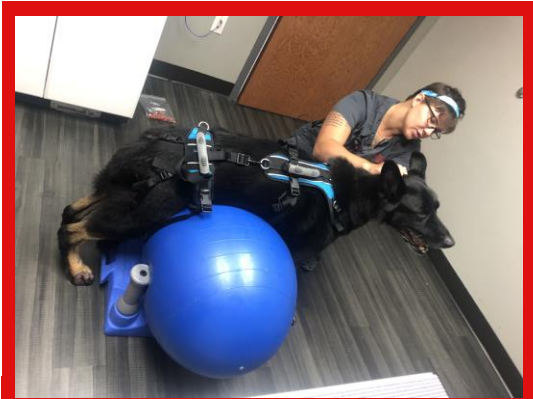

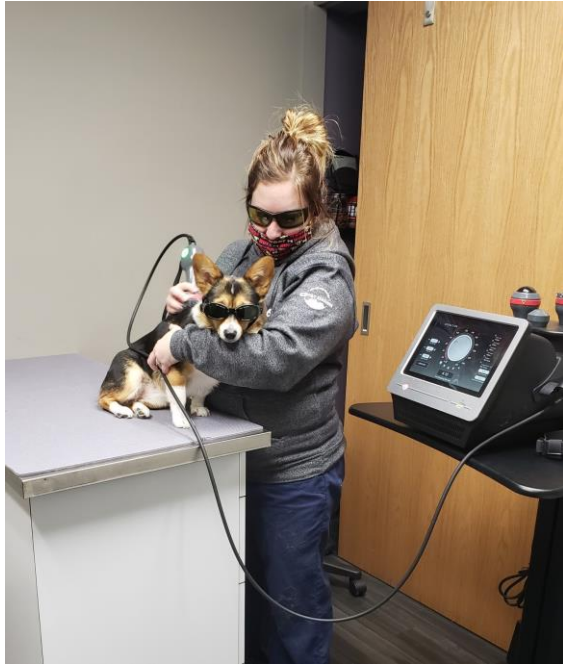

Laser therapy continued

Light therapy can be used for ear and skin infections, wounds, post-surgical incisions, gingivitis, arthritis, and neurological conditions arising from the spinal cord. These are the most common situations that PVC encounters on a daily basis. Your pet will be fitted with doggles (pet specific goggles) for the therapy session. If you are assisting with the treatment you also will get to wear some stylish light protectant glasses! Depending on the size of the treatment area and what we are treating the sessions range from 5 minutes to 30+ minutes. Pricing is determined by time needed to complete the treatment.

Laser Therapy

Laser therapy is an alternative therapy for inflammatory conditions. The treatments are applied directly to the area of concern, are non-invasive, drug free, versatile, and effective. Laser therapy uses a beam of laser light to deeply penetrate tissue without damaging it. It induces a biological response in the cells which leads to reduced pain and inflammation and increases the speed of healing. It can also increase your pet's joint flexibility and relieve joint pain. These points can be summarized by stating that there are 3 main benefits of laser therapy-analgesia (eliminating pain), reduced inflammation, and improved recovery.

Physical Rehabilitation

This treatment option is for a wide range of musculoskeletal conditions that our canine and feline patients are susceptible to. When you are scheduled for a rehabilitation assessment, Ally Fishbaugh, RVT, CCRP will evaluate your pet, discuss your goals for rehab, and work with you to develop a custom plan to meet you and your pet's needs. Options range from an assessment with the creation of a home exercise/rehab plan or in clinic sessions. The in clinic sessions include laser therapy if applicable.
